The Pastor's Corner

January 30, 2022

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

During the more than three decades that I spent in ministry at St. Francis of Assisi in New York City, I witnessed the growing internationalization of the people who came to Mass and Confessions there. Looking out at the assembly during a typical weekday or Sunday Mass, it seemed to me that the whole world was represented!

It is said that people pray most easily in their native language, and that is certainly true. While hearing Confessions, the penitents would often ask me: "Father, can I say the Act of Contrition in my language?" And I heard it prayed in many different languages, especially Spanish and French. I got brave for a while and used to keep the Spanish and French translations of the Prayer of Absolution on my iPhone. So, if a penitent said the Act of Contrition in, say, French, I managed to say my part in French as well. No one will ever mistake me for a Parisian, but I did surprise a few folks with my French Absolution! I remember one lovely lady from Haiti complimenting me by saying: "Father, I didn't know you spoke French," and I replied: "Neither did !!"

The point of this little story is to highlight the universal nature of the Catholic Church, and how much our brothers and sisters from other parts of the world matter to us, whether we live in New York City or Hartford, Connecticut. I feel so blessed for having met fellow Christians from so many parts of the world, including South and Central America, Europe, Africa, Asia, Australia and Oceania. And here in Hartford, we are blessed to have as our Sister Parish, Sainte-Geneviève in Zoranje, Haiti.

As I hope you know from reading this bulletin for the past few months, we have been looking at the Covenant relationship with our Sister Parish with the intention of renewing the Covenant in the near future. Originally established in 2005, the Covenant between St. Patrick-St. Anthony and Ste.-Geneviève was intended to prayerfully deepen the relationship between our two parishes by all possible means, including visits whenever possible.

Through the efforts of a dedicated committee here in Hartford, a number of our parishioners have traveled to Haiti over the past 15 years and have brought back stories, photos and invaluable memories of a very faith-filled and loving community. Unfortunately, the COVID epidemic, coupled with political instability, has curtailed travel between the U.S. and Haiti, at least for the time being.



Our parish's International Giving Tree project each Christmas gives us the opportunity to strengthen the bond with our Sister Parish. The funds raised by the Giving Tree continue to support the teachers' salaries and a vital lunch program for the students of the Ste.-Geneviève School. The photos on the cover of today's bulletin show some of the students enjoying their hot meal. We hope that we have been able to heighten your awareness of, and interest in, our Sister Parish over the past few months. 

Do you have the desire and intention to pray


more? Do you sometimes find it's hard to follow through the way you want to...with the busyness, complexities and competing commitments of life? A group of parishioners has been

Sister Parish: The Feast of St. Genevieve

Today, January 30, we celebrate the Feast of St. Genevieve. Her actual feast day is January 3, but because of the many events celebrated during the Christmas season, we honor the Patron of our Sister Parish on the last Sunday in January.

At an early age, Genevieve dedicated herself completely to Christ through a life of prayer, penance, and good works. There is a prayer to St. Genevieve reflecting this devotion:

Good, gracious, and loving God, we give you thanks and praise for the example of your beloved servant, Saint Genevieve. By your grace, she fed the hungry, healed the sick, and showed your forgiving mercy. She revealed your presence to the poor, the abandoned and the unemployed. May we continue the exemplary work of Saint



Genevieve, reject temptation, strive for justice, peace, and love one another.

We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen!

Genevieve was born c.422 in Nanterre, a small village outside of Paris and she died in Paris c. 512. When Attila and his army of Huns came toward Paris 451, the Parisian Christians were prepared to flee their homes. Genevieve spoke to them, convincing all to stay in their homes to pray and fast for God's protection. Their prayers were answered when Atilla changed his course and turned away from Paris.
