The Pastor's Corner

March 20, 2022

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

One of the hymns we will sing this weekend is called "Be Still, for the Presence of the Lord," a contemporary hymn written by British songwriter David J. Evans in 1986. Evans was involved in the charismatic movement but felt that some of its worship risked treating God in a trivial fashion. One of his inspirations was Exodus 3: 1–6, the first reading for Mass the Third Sunday of Lent, where Moses meets the Lord at the burning bush and is commanded: "Remove the sandals from your feet, for the place where you stand is holy ground."

This is the text of one of the verses:

Be still for the glory of the Lord is shining all around; He burns with Holy fire, with splendor He is crowned. How awesome is the sight — our radiant King of light. Be still for the glory of the Lord is shining all around.

I think each of us has a sense of "holy ground" in our lives. It may be a particular location where an important or memorable event took place, like the place where you proposed to your spouse, or a favorite vacation destination. A friend of mine in New York refers to a particular spot in the Sheep Meadow in Central Park as holy ground because it was there that Barbra Streisand performed her concert in 1967!

Of course, we think of churches, cemeteries or battlefields such as Gettysburg as holy ground. There are others as well. For example, the other day I took a stroll around Bushnell Park and walked by the street where the "Black Lives Matter" sign was painted a few years ago during the protests over the killing of George Floyd by a Minneapolis police officer. It continues to be a stark reminder that we still have a long road to travel for racial justice in our nation.

As we witness the horrific scenes of death and destruction in Ukraine, I can't help but think of the courageous people of that nation fearlessly defending their right to exist as a free and independent country, and paying for that freedom with their own blood, sweat and tears. Ukraine has indeed become Holy Ground.

As we continue to pray for the people of Ukraine, I recommend

that you contribute to the Franciscan
Relief Fund which is providing financial
assistance to the Franciscan Friars in
Ukraine who are determined to remain
with their people throughout the Russian invasion. We will have a special
collection on the weekend of April 2-3
for the Franciscan Relief Fund.



Please join me in congratulating Kimberly Nardone who will receive the St. Joseph Medal of Appreciation this Sunday afternoon at St. Joseph Cathedral. Kim has been a leader during the pandemic. She coordinates a group of teams, including Confirmation candidates, who prepare hot meals for the Warming Center on Sundays. When she discovered that Sunday was the only day folks there had hot dinners, she created a new set of teams to provide hot meals on Wednesday nights also. She organized a baking ministry to allow people to use their skills to prepare fresh baked goods for our Sandwich Ministry. Every Tuesday she can be found outside our Franciscan Center for Urban Ministry serving hot meals to the homeless and working poor. Congratulations, Kim!
