The Pastor's Corner

July 17, 2022

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

In the Shreenan household, whenever the slip covers were removed from the living room sofa and chairs, it was a sure sign that guests were expected. Of course, the preparations would start weeks before the event with my mother cleaning virtually every room in the house from top to bottom, with a warning that we kids better not mess up any of her hard work. Then, the cooking would start a few days before the date, and the good china and silverware would be brought out to be laid on the dining room table. By the time the guests were due to arrive, the Jell-O molds had chilled, the ham and au gratin potatoes had been baked, the guest towels in the bathroom had been hung, and the ash trays and coasters had been set out, including the extra folding chairs and TV trays.

Sound familiar? I don't think my mother was all that different from most mothers back in the 60's and 70's. Entertaining guests was a high-energy undertaking, and folks took great pride in making their homes as attractive and welcoming as possible. Except for one of our neighbors and a good friend of my parents whose housekeeping skills left a bit to be desired, and whose greatest concern was making sure the "extra" refrigerator was always stocked with beer. However, she was one of the most hospitable, friendly and funny persons I knew. She wasn't hung up on all the finer things in life; it was her friends and neighbors who mattered the most.

Mary in today's Gospel. Together, the two sisters from Bethany made a great team. Each had her own particular interests and gifts. But Martha, the fussbudget of the duo, had to come to realize that she and her sister Mary didn't have to compete with each other for Jesus' attention or affection. That's a good lesson for all of us to learn. We don't have to be all things for all people all the time. Each of us has our own unique gifts to bring to the table. It's what makes our relationships so exciting and special.

I am reminded here of the lyrics from one of the songs in Jerry Herman's musical "La Cage Aux Folles" where one of the characters sings: "I am what I am I am my own special creation. So come take a look, give me the hook or the ovation. It's my world that I want to take a little pride in, my world, and it's not a place I have to hide in. Life's not worth a damn, 'til you can say, 'Hey world, I am what I am.'" In other words, our differences and our uniqueness are what make the world go 'round. Be yourself, be good to others, and enjoy each moment as it comes!



Support our Sister Parish Through Christmas in July

Through our Covenant with St. Genevieve parish in Zorange, we committed to and have been able to provide a hot lunch and teacher salaries for the school. Without our support, an academic education with a noontime meal, most likely would not be available. In addition, another challenge is that conditions in Haiti continue to decline, since the 2010 earthquake and subsequent upheavals (political and natural disasters.) Prices for food and other commodities continue to rise.

Sharing Meals in Z'oranje

On one trip to Haiti, Fr. Philippe, the then pastor at St. Genevieve Church, taught us this Créole blessing before a meal:

Manje sa a Ou voye ban nou, Papa, Manje ki bay lavi. This food You have sent us, Father, is the food that gives life.

During one of the early visits to St. Genevieve Church, the travelers walked over to the cooks as they were cleaning up at the end of the day to thank them for all their hard work. One of the women replied that they were happy to work as hard as they did because, when we were there on a visit, they got to eat. That one comment gave us an insight into the problem of food insecurity in the community.

In the region of Z'oranje, the main problem with food insecurity is malnutrition, not starvation. Many of the locals eat only what is in season. If it is the mango season, they eat mangoes. If it is the season for a different fruit or vegetable, they eat that fruit or vegetable. Meat or fish is a rarity for far too many people.

Because the students at the St. Genevieve parish school receive a hot lunch 5 days a week during the 10-month school year, their families are able to use their limited food supplies to give a bit more to the family

members who do not attend the school. The benefits of the school lunch program extend well beyond the students in the school.

"A little goes a long way" is a very true saying, for our Christmas in July effort. We offer some additional information to show how far contributions can go. The protein for lunch is typically fish (often Herring) and takes \$29./day to include it in each of the 413 meals. A



vegetable, often peas, takes \$42./day. The total cost for lunches for students in all grades equals \$2705./month, or \$125./day. Sometimes the pastor, Fr. Dominque, contributes to help ensure a nutritious meal. Can you help in any way?




Come Celebrate the Life of John Ullrich, O.F.M. +
