The Pastor's Corner

October 9, 2022

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As today's Gospel about the healing of the ten lepers proclaims a theme of thanksgiving, I find myself feeling very thankful for the blessings of the past week as we celebrated the feast of St. Francis of Assisi. I am particularly thankful for all our parishioners who took part in the various events, but especially for those who volunteered their time and talents to make those events happen.

In his beautiful Canticle of the Creatures, St. Francis praised God for "Brother Wind, and through the air, cloudy and serene, and every kind of weather." For better or for worse, Brother Wind certainly made his presence known! But wind and some rain didn't dampen the enthusiasm of those who made their way to the Blessing of Animals and the Parish Potluck Picnic, both of which had to be moved indoors. 



Herrick's "Lasua" series is a direct expression of his experience dealing with cancer. When he was diagnosed, Herrick fell into darkness, feeling defenseless as he confronted the disease. Through his treatment journey, however, he discovered compassion and support, gaining deep insight into "angels" of creativity.

Herrick's painting process helped him move from the depths of fear into hope, as well as informing his recovery from addiction and depression. In his process of painting, he let his hands be guided by the spirit inside him, allowing his cancer to wield the brush in whatever way it wished. Uncertain at first, he remained committed to the process. One single theme emerged: supportive angels, as healers, guiding him to wellness. Each painting has a story that can be read as a meditation.

HOW TO REPORT AN INCIDENT OF SEXUAL ABUSE TO THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

If you have knowledge or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult (an adult with an intellectual disability) has been sexually abused, in any manner, by personnel of the Archdiocese of Hartford, you are urged to report this information to:

In addition, you will be asked to follow up in writing with a detailed description of the facts involved in the incident. Specifics of this written report can be found in the Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Hartford Relating to Allegations of Sexual Misconduct Involving Minors and Vulnerable Adults. This document is also available online at www.archdioceseofhartford.org.

The Archdiocese of Hartford will report any and all incidents to the proper civil authorities.

Mandated reporters in the State of Connecticut are required by law to report any incident of sexual abuse involving a minor or vulnerable adult. We encourage any Non-Mandated persons to report such incidents to the proper authorities as well.

We support your right to do so.

Incidents involving sexual abuse of minors (persons under the age of 18) should be reported to:

Once a written report of an incident of sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult has been received, an investigation will be undertaken by, or on behalf of, the Archdiocese of Hartford.


