In the summer months the leaves of the plant are a source of nourishment for 15 species of butterflies and caterpillars. In the fall and winter, the cones of the flower continue to provide food for migrating and wintering songbirds. You can help to Care for God's Creation by planting Black-Eyed Susan's and other native plant species in your yard. Women in the Church: our History, our Present, and our Future



The Women of Hope at SPSA are encouraged by our parish's response to Pope Francis' invitation to a Church-wide "Synod on synodality." The listening sessions held here

during the Synod's initial consultation period produced a report for the Synod; we now have the Vatican's synthesis: "Enlarge the Space of Your Tent" (October 2022). In this global report, we see both laments and dreams for the Church -- and for women in the Church -- shared by women, men and youth worldwide.

As Women of Hope we continue to walk this "synodal path," and invite you to join us for further listening, prayer, and reflection about these matters close to our hearts. We trust all the while that God's own Spirit will be our guide on this journey together. Watch for updates from us here in the bulletin over the coming months.

This week we share excerpts from two key paragraphs from "Enlarge the Space of Your Tent" regarding women's participation in and contribution to the Church.

¶ 60. The call for a conversion of the Church's culture ... A critical and urgent area in this regard concerns the role of women and their vocation, rooted in our common baptismal dignity, to participate fully in the life of the Church. A growing awareness and sensitivity towards this issue is registered all over the world.

¶ 61. From all continents comes an appeal for Catholic women to be valued first and foremost as baptised and equal members of the People of God... The Holy Land report notes:... "In a Church where almost all decision-makers are men, there are few spaces where women can make their voices heard. Yet they are the backbone of Church communities, both because they represent the majority of the practising members and because they are among the most active members of the Church."

The Korean report confirms: "Despite the great participation of women in various Church activities, they are often excluded from key decision-making processes. Therefore, the Church needs to improve its awareness and institutional aspects of their activities" (EC Korea).

In our next update, we will share more insights identified on a global level.

Religious Education Registration 2023-2024 will open May 1st!

The religious education programs at St. Patrick — St. Anthony Church are designed to allow parents to choose not only the best schedule for their young children but also the best learning format for those children. We firmly believe that the parents (and families) are the original and primary educators of their children, and we are honored to support you in nurturing your child's faith. Our classes begin at age three.

For this reason, religious education for children through sixth grade can occur at St. Patrick — St. Anthony Church within a traditional format, a hands-on (Montessori) format (Catechesis of the Good Shepherd) or a family format (Whole Community Catechesis).

All students come together in one seventh and eighth grade program so that they can begin to form a cohesive group for our ninth and tenth grade Confirmation class. Our 7,8 and high schoolers are very involved in social justice and community service.
