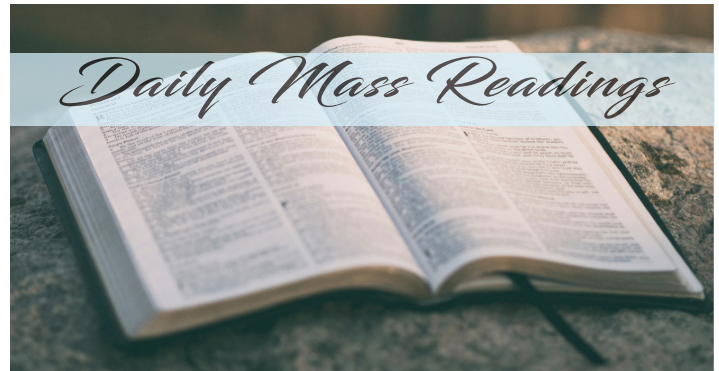

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I am delighted to extend my congratulations to the St. Patrick-St. Anthony Ladies Guild as they celebrate their 85th anniversary this weekend. Members of the Guild will take part in the annual May Crowning ceremony at the 10:00 Mass, to be followed by a special luncheon in the Franciscan Center.



Back in May 1938, following a novena service to Saint Theresa, the Little Flower, four parishioners of St. Anthony Church—Bea DeLeo, Anna Guerrierio, Minnie Miano and Olive Pinto—met at Casa Maria, across from the Rectory. Conversation led to the organization, formation and first official meeting of The St. Anthony Church Ladies Guild. From those simple beginnings, the Guild flourished, as it organized fund-raising events for the parish and its school. The Ladies Guild also took on the task of making beautiful baptismal garments for infant baptisms, which they continue to do today.

The Ladies Guild also provides annual scholarships for students in our parish who attend a Catholic elementary, middle or high school.

Our Provincial Minister, Fr. Kevin Mullen, O.F.M., sent a congratulatory letter to thank the Ladies Guild for their 85 years of service to St. Patrick-St. Anthony parish which you can read in the adjacent column.

Also this weekend, 31 young members of our parish received the Sacrament of Confirmation at the Cathedral of St. Joseph. They were joined by almost 200 other young people from around the Hartford Archdiocese and their families to celebrate the sacrament which makes them fully initiated members of the Catholic faith. We can be very proud of these young people who have taken this significant step in their commitment to Christ. Empowered by the Holy Spirit and through the anointing they received, they are now fully equipped to witness their faith in Jesus Christ. Please join me in wishing them much joy in living their Christian vocation.

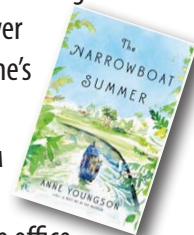

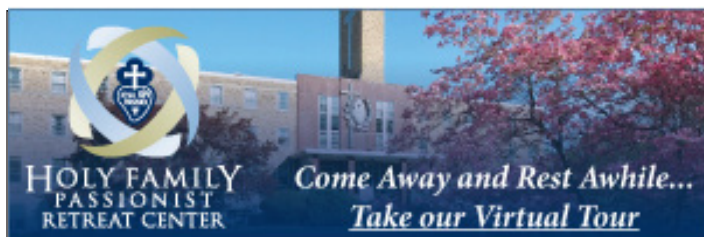

# Legislative Updates

As of April 27, 2023

## Fair Share Zoning Reform

HB 6633 was voted out of the Housing Committee.

Contact your legislator to support increasing affordable housing.

## Mental Health: HUSKY 4 Immigrants

HB 6616 was voted out of committee with coverage up to age 19. The Appropriations Committee knocked it back to age 16.

Contact your legislator and ask them to raise the age back to 19.

## Gun Violence Prevention

The Appropriations Committee allocated \$17 million for this issue. GHIAA's ask is \$20 million. Contact your legislator.

## MIRA Plant

HB 6664 addresses some of the state's on-going trash problems. Contact your legislator to support the bill with amendments:

- at least 50% of the board from Hartford
- remediation of the Southend plant won't be limited by MIRA's current reserves

## Education

HB 5003 is in front of the House for a full vote.

Contact your legislator to support fully funding the Education Cost Sharing formula and closing CT's racial funding gap.

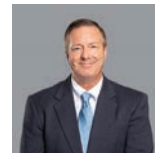
