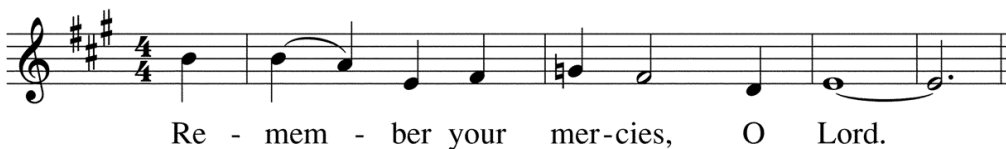

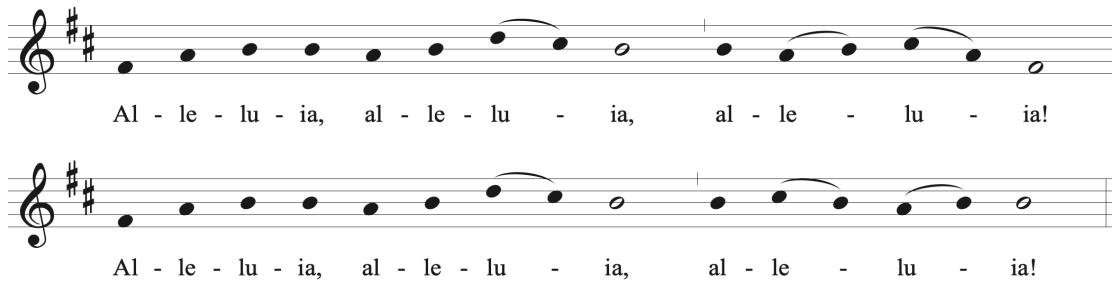

NICENE CREED






