

# The Paston's Corner

October 1, 2023

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As we celebrate the Feast of our Holy Father Francis of Assisi this week, let us keep in mind all the participants of the Synod on Synodality which will be held in Rome beginning this week. The Church's massive synodal process has already undergone diocesan, national, and continental stages. It will culminate in two global assemblies at the Vatican. The first will take place October 4–28 and the second in October 2024 to advise the pope on the topic "For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, Mission."


There is much hope for this particular synod especially because everyone in the Church was invited to take part in it. At St. Patrick-St. Anthony a special committee held numerous listening sessions which included many parishioners. Their discussions were distilled into a report which was submitted to the commission charged with organizing the global synod. The *Instrumentum Laboris* document guiding the discussions at the synod assembly includes topics such as including women deacons, priestly celibacy, and LGBTQ outreach. So let us pray that the Holy Spirit will guide all those who will be gathered in Rome this coming month, and that their deliberations will bear much good fruit for the future of our Catholic Church.

I hope you will join us for the celebrations of the Feast of St. Francis this week, including the beautiful Transitus service on Tuesday evening, October 3, at 7:00 PM. The story of the final hours and death of St. Francis will be told, and our choir will sing some beautiful music, including works by Hutmacher, Friedell and Rutter, as well as my own setting of Psalm 142. On Wednesday, October 4, our Masses at 7:30 and 12:05 will be the Solemnity of St. Francis of Assisi.

On Monday, October 9, our new Coadjutor Archbishop, Christopher J. Coyne, will be officially welcomed to Hartford at a Mass which will be celebrated at St. Joseph Cathedral beginning at 2:00 PM. Archbishop Blair has asked me to extend an invitation to all our parishioners to attend the Mass and the reception afterwards in Aetna's auditorium. Parking will be available in the Aetna parking garage on Sigourney Street. There will be Knights of Columbus and signage to direct both auto and foot traffic to the Cathedral. Limited handicap parking will be available in the Cathedral parking lot on Asylum Street.

Finally, as we look ahead to the celebration of Christmas (yes, it will be here before you know it!), I invite all our parishioners to

become an ornament for our parish Christmas Tree in the church. The idea is to create ornaments with photos of individuals, couples or families to hang on the tree. Each photo will be mounted on either gold or red card stock and hung on the tree. Here is a sample I made:





# **Clothing Drive Thank You**

Dear Parishioners of St Patrick-St Anthony Parish,

We want to take the opportunity to thank you so much for your participation in our Clothing Collection for the Ukrainian and Haitian Youth Refugees that culminated in the final truck pick up on Monday 9/11. When the desperate needs of these youth were brought forward, you heard that call, and you responded as you were able. Many of you chose to donate new and/or gently used clothing items, school supplies, diapers, gift cards, or cash which will all bring a richness to these vulnerable youth. So many of you physically helped us throughout the course of the weekend of our Clothing Collection, and just know we never could have done this without all your help! We are confident that all of you held, and currently hold, these youth in your prayers as they continue to find their way in this new place they now call home. Your donations, in conjunction with the donations from the Notre Dame de Namur Community of both Sisters and Associates, the Mercy Community of both Sisters and Associates, as well as parishioners from 2 parishes in the Windsor Locks area resulted in 2 truckloads of donated items, over \$4,400 in gift cards, and over \$3,000 in cash. All of this will go to helping our youth refugees ready themselves for the school year and for the cold months of winter ahead. Now we know that only 1 truckload of items left from our Franciscan Center on 9/11. What you did not see was another truckload of donated items that came from the Notre Dame de Namur Community of both Sisters and Associates in Ipswich MA, Worcester MA, and from the Windsor CT area. One of the Notre Dame de Namur Associates rented a truck and drove all those donated items up to the collection site in MA. Never have the CT Mercy Associates ever collaborated with another Community of Associates around such an outreach opportunity. This is a first for the CT Mercy Associates and the Notre Dame de Namur Associates, and this is to be acknowledged and celebrated! Together these 2 Communities have bonded with you, our parishioners, in a way that enabled us to bring good into our world for those who have been bruised along the way. It is clear that each of you has a generous

and compassionate heart, a deep commitment to serve, and a will-ingness to share God's love with those who are so in need of this. Please know that, for all that you have done, you have the deepest thanks of our entire Clothing Collection Committee, and please



remember what a difference you have made!




