The Paston's Corner

November 5, 2023

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

A front-page article in the October 30 issue of the Hartford Courant featured an extensive interview with Coadjutor Archbishop Christopher Coyne and what he plans to be his primary focus when he succeeds Archbishop Blair next April.

"My main thrust is going to be just to be a missionary," he told his interviewer. Archbishop Coyne feels that, with many Catholics having fallen away from the Church, he hopes to open the door of welcome to those who have stopped coming — for various reasons.

Part of it, he admits, was the sexual abuse scandal, of which he was the spokesperson in the Archdiocese of Boston under the late Cardinal Law. But the pandemic also took its toll, as we all know. Church teachings and policies have also had a negative impact on many Catholics.

As the article said: "Coyne believes the answer is to be welcoming, to meet people where they are. That's the secret to the mega-churches' success, he believes.

'To try and encourage people to join and be part of a beautiful community like we have is difficult, especially because they feel like they have to pass a test before they can become part of the church too,' Coyne said. 'I simple say, let's just start with where a person is now when they walk through the door.'

That includes LGBTQ people, Coyne said. 'When I left the cathedral parish in Burlington to come here, there were a large number of gay and lesbian men and women, families that were there, folks who felt welcomed, encouraged... You're not perfect, like I'm not perfect... but we walk together, we encourage each other, we find our way."

I found the Archbishop's words to be very supportive and positive towards a community that has struggled to find acceptance in the Church, but has flourished here at St. Patrick-St. Anthony, thanks to the welcoming atmosphere that was established here over thirty years ago. In addition, ministries such as Open Hearts and Friends and Family have helped many people to find a home here.

I am particularly grateful to Rich Broggini for the presentations he has been making to the parents of children in our religious



education program, as well as to the parish in general as he did on Tuesday evening, October 24th. As a middle school teacher, as well as the father of an adult son who is gay, Rich has a wealth of knowledge of the issues involved in being Catholic and gay. He is a wonderful role model of a parent who has had to find answers to difficult questions, and is more than willing to share his experience with those who want to know more. So, I thank him and Tim Curran who serve as the coordinators of our Friends and Family ministry.

In a few weeks, at the 5:00 PM Mass on Sunday, November 19th, we will observe the International Transgender Day of Remembrance for transgender persons who have died as victims of transphobic violence during the past year. This annual event, sponsored by our Open Hearts LGBTQ+ Ministry, is our way of showing our support as a community that welcomes everyone.

Advent Daytime Retreat: The Art of the Jesse Tree

Tuesday, December 5

Begin your Advent Retreat Day with our 12:05 Mass. Come over to the Franciscan Center for a light lunch from 12:30-1:00 PM.

The presentation and prayer will take place in the Center from 1:00-4:00 PM.

Along with the Advent wreath and Advent calendar, the Jesse Tree is a popular tradition of the season in which we prepare for the birth of Jesus. Dating back to the Middle Ages, the Jesse Tree is a representation of the ancestors of Jesus, taking its name from the prophecy of Isaiah (11:1): "A shoot shall sprout from the stump of Jesse, and from his roots a bud shall blossom." Join us for an afternoon in early Advent as we explore the various ways in which the Jesse Tree has been pictured from the Middle Ages to the present day in illuminated manuscripts, stained glass windows, painting, and sculpture. A Message from the Sister Parish:

Every weekend, we have the opportunity to celebrate Mass in our church without fearing for our safety. Our sister and brother parishioners in St. Genevieve Parish in Haiti don't have that opportunity because gathering in church puts them in too great a danger of being injured, kidnapped or killed by the gangs who are terrorizing that country.

Every school day in CT, we send our children and grandchildren to school where we are comfortable that they are safe. Most of our brother and sister parishioners don't send their young ones to school because it would put them in too great a danger of being kidnapped and held for ransom by the gangs.

If we need to speak with one of the friars who provide us wonderful service, we know where we can find them. Our sister and brother parishioners do not know where their pastor is on any given day because he has to continually change his location to avoid being kidnapped by one of the gangs.

Every night, we retire to our beds where we sleep safely. Our brother and sister parishioners in Haiti sleep outside most nights because too often the gangs burn down houses at night with people in them.

At this point, there is no functioning government in Haiti to which our sisters and brothers can look to address the hellacious conditions in which they are forced to live.

Confronted with this reality and concluding that we could not go on only asking God to somehow intervene in the situation, the members of the Sister Parish Committee initiated an advocacy effort to persuade the US Government to:

- Sanction the wealthy Haitians who are funding the gangs.
- Stop the illegal shipment of guns from the US to the Haitian gangs.
- Support the deployment of an international peace keeping force to Haiti to provide the safety, security and peace that Haitians need to re-establish a functioning government.

We have engaged with representatives of parishes IN TEN STATES all of whom have the same type of relationships with Haitian parishes that we have. Everyone in this group is working as we are with our representatives in Congress for the actions listed above. All of us agree with what President John F. Kennedy said at the very end of his inaugural address. We ask of God His blessing and His help, but knowing that here on earth God's work must truly be our own.

Working with that spirit, we are making progress. We will share that progress in next week's bulletin and parish email. So, watch this space.


