

The Paston's Corner

March 3, 2024

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

This past week our newly-formed Parish Vocations Committee met for the first time. In addition to myself, the committee members are Pat Curtis, Carole Fay, and Ron and Joan Osella. We had a very energetic conversation and spoke about our call as baptized Christians as described in one of the documents of the Second Vatican Council, "Lumen Gentium." This important document is also known as the "The Dogmatic Constitution on the Church" because it spells out the nature of the Church as the People of God, united to Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit.

Chapter Five of Lumen Gentium is titled "The Universal Call to Holiness" through our baptism, in which we become a member of the body of Christ. Here is brief excerpt from paragraph 40: "Thus it is evident to everyone, that all the faithful of Christ of whatever rank or status, are called to the fullness of the Christian life and to the perfection of charity; by this holiness as such a more human manner of living is promoted in this earthly society. In order that the faithful may reach this perfection, they must use their strength accordingly as they have received it, as a gift from Christ."

All of us, then, are called to live more and more like Jesus and to strive throughout our lives to become holy people by our faith, our hope, and our love for God and our neighbor. In a sense, this is our common vocation. How we choose to live out our baptismal covenant is for each of us to decide.

Clare Gallery's first 2024 exhibition is Leave No Trace by Sariah Park. Park is an interdisciplinary artist of European and Indigenous descent, and is an enrolled member of the Chiricahua Apache Nation. Issues of identity, culture, and the act of making in relation to the

Park states, "This work shows the transformation of material made immaterial, craft as a form of ceremony, and the transfer of energy and spirit into a living process, striving to become in balance with the natural world."

A Sobering Fact: 2024 vs 2023

As we leap into March, let's look back.

In February of 2023 our ministry served a total of 2,846 sand-wiches and 320 hot meals. In February of 2024 we served a total of 4,416 sandwiches and 690 hot meals. February 2024 saw a 55% increase in the number of sandwiches served and a 115% increase in hot meals.

Thank you so much to the St. Patrick-St. Anthony Faith Community for all your hard work and generosity in funding food purchases, baking, providing treats and loaves of bread, making sandwiches and preparing hot meals, and serving them.

Together, as a community, we were able to keep up with this increase.

No Freeze Shelter Meals - Update

As you know, each Sunday, through March 31st, our parishioners cometogether to prepare a Sunday dinner for the Shelter. We are still looking for donations for our February 4th and February 11th meals.

2024 Palm Sunday "Weekend" Food Drive

Dear St. Patrick-St. Anthony Family,

As we enter the season of Lent, we are asking our parishioners for another act of kindness — contributing to the 2024 Palm Sunday "Weekend" Food Drive on March 23-24. Food insecurity continues to be a challenge for many living in the City of Hartford. Sadly, Hartford is at the top of the statistics list according to CT Foodshare. "Hartford has a Food Insecurity Rate of 19.3% - the highest percentage in the State. Higher than New Haven, New London, Waterbury and Bridgeport."

You can support the food drive for needy families served by the House of Bread and Hands on Hartford by donating the following items: peanut butter, rice, dried beans, pasta, pasta sauce, can of tuna and chicken, cereal, granola bars, sugar, ground coffee and canned vegetables. (view the online shopping list)

All the items plus a jar of jelly can be purchased at Aldi's for \$30. If you can provide multiples of some items (cereal, food bars, tuna, pasta), it would be a bonus for a family. Tucking in something "Eastery" would be a nice touch and appreciated by families with children.

A couple of IFS. If you cannot donate all the items, consider dropping off any of the protein items — canned tuna/ chicken, jars of peanut butter or coffee. If grocery shopping is not an option for you, monetary donations can also be made with checks payable to "House of Bread". Checks can be dropped off during the curbside collection or placed in the collection basket in an envelope marked for the House of Bread.

If there are any doubts to if participating in this food drive makes a difference? Consider the words of Mother Theresa on hunger, "If you can't feed a hundred people, then just feed one."

We ask that you bring your donation in a durable box or reinforced bag on Saturday, March 23 before the 4:00 PM Mass on Saturday, on Sunday, March 24 between 9:00 AM-Noon, or **just before** the 5:00 PM Mass. Volunteers will be on hand curbside to collect your donation.

A Faith of Many Rooms with Debie Thomas (Online) March 20 from 7 to 8:30 PM

In the Gospels, Jesus describes the Kingdom of God as a house with "many rooms." The implication is that the realm of God is wide, abundant, and spacious. But this is not how many people experience contemporary Christianity. Though Scripture is rife with metaphors of spaciousness, the language people often use when they're struggling with their faith is the language of narrowness, constriction, and confinement. What might a "big enough" Christianity actually look like? What sorts of ruptures and reconciliations would it take to find a bigger house of faith, and inhabit it with both authenticity and joy? Join author Debie Thomas for an exploration of the themes and questions that animate her new book on "a spacious Christianity." What does a roomy salvation look like? Can we have faith and be "lost" at the same time? What roles do sorrow and lament play in a truly robust Christianity? Safeguarding God's people

Although we are unable to undo the past, the Franciscan Friars of the Province of Our Lady of Guadalupe know of the profound suffering and harm that incidents of sexual abuse of minors and sexual misconduct by some members of religious orders have caused innocent people and the Church community at large.

The Province of Our Lady of Guadalupe does not tolerate or excuse the sexual abuse of a minor or sexual exploitation of a person receiving pastoral care by a friar of the province. Consistent with our Franciscan heritage, the province is committed to listening attentively to any allegation made by a person who believes that he or she has been harmed. The province is committed to full compliance with its policies regarding sexual abuse and sexual exploitation of an adult. Sexual abuse of a minor and sexual exploitation is contrary to our vowed life and our profession to live the Gospel. Reporting abuse is difficult and painful. Rest assured, this process is safe, confidential, and compassionate.

We encourage anyone who has been abused by a friar from this province to contact us through one of the ways provided below. Whatever means you choose to reach out, it is our genuine hope to help support you in your healing.

We are committed to listening openly to anyone making a complaint against a friar. The Province of Our Lady of Guadalupe proactively enforces its polices with an active Provincial Review Board composed of laypeople and friars. The board addresses complaints with the utmost respect and compassion.

How to report misconduct & view allegations:

If you have information about alleged sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult by a friar, employee, or volunteer of the Province of Our Lady of Guadalupe, report it by calling National Survivor/Victim Assistance Coordinator Angelica Jochim, MFT, at 1-800-770-8013 or emailing angelica.jochim@gmail.com. She will return your message within one business day.

Allegations of sexual abuse will be reported to civil authorities regardless of whether the accused friar is living or dead, or whether he is a current or former member of the province.

HOW TO REPORT AN INCIDENT OF SEXUAL ABUSE TO THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

If you have knowledge or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult (an adult with an intellectual disability) has been sexually abused, in any manner, by personnel of the Archdiocese of Hartford, you are urged to report this information to:

In addition, you will be asked to follow up in writing with a detailed description of the facts involved in the incident. Specifics of this written report can be found in the <u>Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Hartford Relating to Allegations of Sexual Misconduct Involving Minors and Vulnerable Adults</u>. This document is also available online at <u>www.archdioceseofhartford.org</u>. The Archdiocese of Hartford will report any and all incidents to the proper civil authorities.

Mandated reporters in the State of Connecticut are required by law to report any incident of sexual abuse involving a minor or vulnerable adult. We encourage any Non-Mandated persons to report such incidents to the proper authorities as well. We support your right to do so.
