

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

The 11th verse of the 2nd chapter of the Song of Songs in the Bible says: "Behold, the winter is past; the rain is over and gone." How I wish it were so! While we enjoyed a dry and sunny Easter weekend, it seems that the winter rains have not exited the stage as of yet. Nevertheless, I am still basking in the beauty and joyous solemnity of the Paschal Triduum, as I hope you are as well. My thanks go out to so many people for making the liturgies of Holy Week so inspiring and memorable.

The cold I came down with on Monday of Holy Week prevented me from participating in the Chrism Mass at St. Joseph Cathedral, but we were represented by Carolyn Abramo and Kristina DiDominzio who brought the Holy Oils back to the parish. Carolyn was also chosen to be one of the presenters of the gifts at the Mass, and here she is, having just presented the wine to Archbishop Blair.



It has been wonderful to witness the involvement of more of our young parishioners in the celebration of the liturgy, and I was particularly gratified to see several of our Confirmation candidates present at the Liturgy of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday. They took turns presenting the cross for veneration, and did so with dignity and reverence. Our young readers also played an important role at the Easter Vigil as well as Easter Sunday. 
Ministry of the Door Volunteer Opportunity

Clare Gallery: Watershed Journeys

March 22-May 28, 2024

During our next exhibit we feature Diana Rogers, a Connecticut-based plein air artist who captures the changes of nature by surrounding herself with it year-round. As her senses are heightened by nature's influence, Rogers can feel its power and presence while she creates. She believes nature's



inherent rhythms connect to our lives, if we embrace its gifts.

The Connecticut River and its surrounding watershed are the subject for Rogers' *Watershed Journeys*.

The River is a vital resource to all living creatures and natural systems. As Rogers states, "During this project, I witnessed the unfolding seasons and the cycle of renewal in nature. Spring and summer sprouted lush greens, and autumn's blazing colors eventually faded into quiet winter hues. The resulting paintings are like candid portraits that reflect the rhythms of life across the ecosystem."

Rogers has a background in the medical and scientific fields, which influence her art-making practice today. She is represented by Gallery One CT, and her work is held in private and public collections across the US.

HOW TO REPORT AN INCIDENT OF SEXUAL ABUSE TO THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

If you have knowledge or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult (an adult with an intellectual disability) has been sexually abused, in any manner, by personnel of the Archdiocese of Hartford, you are urged to report this information to:

In addition, you will be asked to follow up in writing with a detailed description of the facts involved in the incident. Specifics of this written report can be found in the <u>Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Hartford Relating to Allegations of Sexual Misconduct Involving Minors and Vulnerable Adults</u>. This document is also available online at <u>www.archdioceseofhartford.org</u>. The Archdiocese of Hartford will report any and all incidents to the proper civil authorities.

Mandated reporters in the State of Connecticut are required by law to report any incident of sexual abuse involving a minor or vulnerable adult. We encourage any Non-Mandated persons to report such incidents to the proper authorities as well. We support your right to do so.

Incidents involving sexual abuse of minors (persons under the age of 18) should be reported to:
