Dear Parishioners and Friends,

"God, what do you want me to do with my life?"

Do you find this question crossing your mind or lingering in your heart periodically? Well, you're in good company! As baptized believers trying to follow the Gospel and live the Christian life in our homes, neighborhoods, workplaces, and communities, we are invited to discern the answers to this question in an ongoing way.

Yes, "answers!" All of us can contemplate this question multiple times throughout our journeys of faith. And it is the question which underpins the broad definition of "vocations" that we are invited to explore. The word "vocation" can engage *all individuals* as we assess and determine our respective paths in life with the grace of the Holy Spirit.

What is your understanding of vocation? It is how God calls you to serve the world. God calls you through Baptism and Confirmation to serve in a specific way of life. A "vocational" call is a strong feeling that you are especially suited to fulfill a particular role. It fills you with a higher purpose typically related to helping others or contributing to a greater societal good.

A vocation is a purpose or a passion that gives meaning to one's life. And, if a person's occupation aligns with their vocation, they are likely to find fulfillment, satisfaction, and purpose in their work.

As a faith community, we have the opportunity, as well as the responsibility, to support one another as we discern our "vocations." We should encourage and accompany each other through these times of thoughtful, prayerful discernment.

Our Parish Vocations Awareness Committee has designed informational and inspirational opportunities this summer and fall to explore the broad definition of vocations. We invite you to look at our emails and bulletins for stories from a variety of women and men who explore the question: "How is my vocation revealing itself in my life?"

August 7: "Open Hearts, Open Minds, Open Doors": Living



Women of Hope Mininstry

It has been an interesting few weeks of news from the Vatican regarding two particular groups



of people at the center of our parish Synod report, the national reports, and even the universal Synod report presented to Pope Francis in 2022-23. Statements about women and the LGBTQ+community from Pope Francis have caused confusion and consternation. Perhaps you have felt it, too.

Our **Women of Hope Ministry** spent time last week discussing the Pope's emphatic 'no' when asked if women could be ordained deacons. *Wasn't this topic under serious consideration in the Synod gathering in October 2023 because it had been raised in Synod listening sessions around the globe? Weren't we all encouraged to spend the year continuing to study the historical evidence of women serving faith communities as ordained deacons in the early church? If so, then why today's 'no'?*

We are still in the Synod process and Synod delegates will gather again this October. If the answer has already been decided, why allow hope to build that change could be on the horizon? Why not hold true to the synodal spirit of deep listening while walking together and allow for the unfolding of dialogue and making room for the Holy Spirit to inspire and guide us?

As Women of Hope, we have decided to move forward with our Summer/Fall/Advent plans and invite all to stand with us and join in gatherings of discussion, prayer and reflection. The grace of Baptism fills us - all of us - with dignity and gifts to be shared for the good of all.

We will commence Evenings of Prayer this summer around topics such as building a culture of peace, cultural diversity in friendship, and non-violence.

Then, please save the date of Saturday, September 28 from 12:30 to 4:00 PM to welcome Christine Schenk, CSJ for an afternoon of presentation, prayer and discussion. Her focus will be: What Does the Countercultural Witness of Early "Mothers of the Church" Call Us to Today?

Vocation Reflection

I remember distinctly saying "No" to the question posed to me by our Mother Superior when I was in 7 th grade if I thought I had a vocation to religious life. I knew there was something other than that for my life, though at the time, I didn't know



what. Back then, vocation was thought of mainly as priesthood or religious life. It was looked at as something you decided to say "yes" to, and then you followed that for the rest of your life. For many people, that has been true. However, I would venture to say, that even those who have chosen a vowed life, learned that there are many moments of discernment throughout the years in how that commitment is lived out.

What I have found in my life is that I have been led each step of the way by something greater than my own desires. From my first "vocation" of wife and mother, which I embraced whole-heartedly, to that of teacher, marriage-prep team, RCIA team, theology student, Adult Faith planner and presenter, to social justice advocate and activist, I have seen the grace of God working in my life to help me share my God-given gifts.

There have been many times when I felt lost or unsure of what I should be doing with my life, but I believe the graces of Baptism and Confirmation enable us to find our calling at any particular moment. If we keep that question before us, "What does God want me to be doing with my life?", and keep a listening ear and open heart, God will speak to us and show us the way, usually by placing people in our lives who show us the face of God. I remember hearing at a retreat, someone reading a quote that said, "a vocation is where our passion meets the needs of the world." I have always found this to be true. If we are prepared to answer the call, we will see the opportunities placed before us without any questions about whether this is right.

Vocation is not a static state that we live in, but a dynamic "yes" to the many ways God calls us throughout the ever-changing circumstances of our lives to reach out and serve others.

If we nurture our prayer life, and have a desire to always be ready to serve, the discernment will be clearer. We can help one another as we all journey to use our gifts, and St. Patrick-St. Anthony has always provided opportunities to learn, to pray, and to reach out. All of us have a vocation, and some in a clearly defined profession, but others lived in ways to meet the needs of a changing world around us.
