* What do our Religious Traditions Teach us About How to Relate to Each Other?

* Readings from Qur'an, hadith and Bible about neighbors and "strangers"

In the name of Allah, the beneficent, the merciful.

--- Qur'an, Surah 1: Al-Fatiha (The Opening) 1:1-7

Praise be to the Lord of the Universe who has created us and made us into tribes and nations, that we may know each other, not that we may despise each other.

-- Qur'an, Surah 49: Al-Hujurāt (The Inner Apartments) 49:13

"Allah will say on the Day of Resurrection:

Where are those who loved each other for the sake of My glory?

Today, on a day when there is no shade but Mine, I shall shelter them with My shade." (hadith: Sahih Muslim)

The Prophet (may peace and blessings be upon him) observed:

"None amongst you truly believes until you love for your sister or brother – or for your neighbor – that which you love for yourself." (hadith: Sahih Bukhari & Sahih Muslim)

What do the Hebrew Scriptures teach us about how to treat our neighbors, and how to "be-friend the other"? Consider "the widow, the orphan, the stranger (in your land)" (Leviticus 19:33-34, Deuteronomy 10:17-19 & 24:17-22.)

* Reflections

What does our own experience teach us about how to be neighbors and friends to each other?

* Silent Meditation

"Insomuch as anyone pushes you nearer to God, he or she is your friend."

(paraphrased from Abraham Kuyper, Dutch Christian theologian & politician, 1837-1920)

Think about examples from your own life in which being a neighbor or a friend to the "other" has been a rewarding experience that had a lasting effect on your life.

* Antiphonal prayer

Sirach 6:14-17 (Hebrew Scriptures), and a poem by Muhammad Ali (Cassius Clay)

A faithful friend is a sturdy shelter; whoever finds one has found a treasure.

Faithful friends are life-saving medicine; those who fear God will find them.

"Friendship is a priceless gift that cannot be bought nor sold, but its value is far greater than a mountain made of gold;

Wealth: it has no ears to listen, no heart to understand, it cannot bring you comfort or reach out a helping hand.

Faithful friends are beyond price, no scale can measure their worth.

Those who fear the Lord direct their friendship aright; as they are, so will their neighbors be.

for gold is cold and lifeless – it can neither see nor hear, in time of trouble, it is powerless to cheer —

So, when you ask God for a gift, be thankful if He sends not diamonds, pearls, or riches but the love of real true friends."

O Allah, protect, help and guide every person that has crossed my path today, and all those faces that I keep seeing in my memories. All the people I love, care for and miss.

All these people who live in my good memories make me believe in humanity again.

Allah, I know that You know everything, but I am forgetful.

My heart reminds me sometimes of names and faces who have made me smile.

I have sometimes long forgotten them, but please let me remember them in my duas. Please accept my duas

and protect those who have brought even the smallest happiness into my life.

I have no means to help them as they have helped me,

so please help them with their concerns - because nothing is impossible for You.

* Final Blessing

Leader:
