






St. Patrick - St. Anthony Ladies Guild 22nd Annual Rev. Dawson D. Trenchard Scholarship

Committee for Social Justice Introduction

God spoke: "Let us make human beings in our image, make them reflecting our nature So they can be responsible for the fish in the sea, the birds in the air, the cattle.



And, yes, Earth itself, and every animal that moves on the face of Earth." - Genesis 1:26 (The Message)

How are we doing as stewards of God's creation? Our daily actions impact our common home. Are we mindful of our actions? In the coming months the Committee for Social Justice (CSJ) will be sending out resources and activities from Catholic Climate Covenant and Laudato Si Movement, which will inform us about our role in caring for creation. Caring for creation is an ongoing process, not a single event.

In the coming weeks we will send out links to videos which show how parishes across the country have responded to the question of stewardship. You will be able to watch these short videos at home, and be able to join in discussions that the CSJ will hold after the series is completed.

Being Stewards of God's Creation: Session 1, September 14/15

"If we acknowledge the value and the fragility of nature and, at the same time, our God-given abilities, we can finally leave behind the modern myth of unlimited

material progress. A fragile world, entrusted by God to human care, challenges us to devise intelligent ways of directing, developing and limiting our power."

Laudato Si (78)

Have we recently experienced the work of God's hands? Have we noticed that things are not as they should be? The "God's Creation Needs You!" video series tells the stories of Catholic communities across the United States who are caring for our common home. These include climate action, advocacy, farming, community organizing, service to others, solar energy, education, prayer, and a focus on

environmental justice. Each of these videos are about three to five minutes long and introduce the work of U.S. Catholic communities as they respond to Laudato Si and Laudate Deum.

This week we introduce the first two of six videos in the series. After all six videos are presented, we will have an opportunity for discussion.

The first video highlights the work of Immaculate Conception parish in Hampton, VA as it leads the way and takes action on creation care locally, nationally, and globally.

HOW TO REPORT AN INCIDENT OF SEXUAL ABUSE TO THE ARCHDIOCESE OF HARTFORD

If you have knowledge or suspect that a minor or vulnerable adult (an adult with an intellectual disability) has been sexually abused, in any manner, by personnel of the Archdiocese of Hartford, you are urged to report this information to:

In addition, you will be asked to follow up in writing with a detailed description of the facts involved in the incident. Specifics of this written report can be found in the Policies and Procedures of the Archdiocese of Hartford Relating to Allegations of Sexual Misconduct Involving Minors and Vulnerable Adults. This document is also available online at www.archdioceseofhartford.org. The Archdiocese of Hartford will report any and all incidents to the proper civil authorities.

Mandated reporters in the State of Connecticut are required by law to report any incident of sexual abuse involving a minor or vulnerable adult. We encourage any Non-Mandated persons to report such incidents to the proper authorities as well. We support your right to do so.

Incidents involving sexual abuse of minors (persons under the age of 18) should be reported to:

Incidents involving sexual abuse of vulnerable adults aged 18 — 59 should be reported to the:

Connecticut Department of Developmental Services — AID Division for Persons with Intellectual Disabilities

Incidents involving sexual abuse of vulnerable adults aged 60 and over should be reported to:

Department of Social Services for the Elderly: 1-888-385-4225

Once a written report of an incident of sexual abuse of a minor or vulnerable adult has been received, an investigation will be undertaken by, or on behalf of, the Archdiocese of Hartford.


