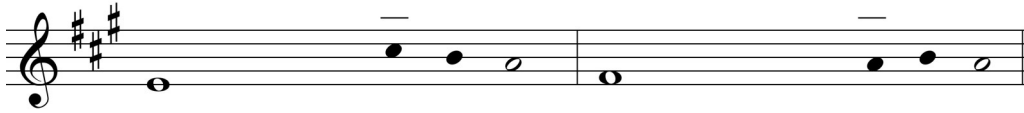

NICENE CREED


