The Pastor's Corner A Letter from Gabe

March 9, 2025

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

I wish to express my thanks and apprecia-

tion to all our Confirmation students who took part in our annual Pancake Breakfast last Sunday following the 8:00 and 10:00 AM Masses. Many parishioners commented on how friendly and helpful the students were, and I was impressed at the mature and outgoing way our young people interacted with us "older" folks. Congratulations and thanks to everyone for making our "Fat Sunday" the enjoyable event it was.

During the pancake breakfast, as well as at other times, and even through some notes and emails I've received recently, several parishioners have expressed very strong feelings regarding the way things have been unfolding under our new presidential administration. However, I am keenly aware that people are experiencing severe emotions of worry and anxiety over a situation they don't understand or can't control.

Because there has been too much angry shouting, too many damaged relationships, too little patience to hear what anyone else is saying.

If you need to talk, we are here for you. In the meantime, let us take care of each other and do whatever is within our means to build up hope and goodness wherever it is needed.






Franciscan Center for Urban Ministry Annual Report for 2024 Growth, Transformation, and Hope

Dear Friends and Supporters,

This past year has been one of growth, transformation, and hope for the Franciscan Center for Urban Ministry. **In 2024, we served 42,920 meals, a 35% increase over 2023.** Despite this rising demand, we finished the year \$600 in the

black thanks to sound stewardship, your contributions, and the tireless efforts of our volunteers. This is a true testimony to the commitment and generosity of our community.





CELEBRATING 25 YEARS

IN 2025, WE WILL CELEBRATE 25 YEARS SINCE THE FRANCISCAN CENTER FIRST OPENED ITS DOORS. FOR A QUARTER OF A CENTURY, THIS CENTER HAS BEEN A PLACE OF HOPE AND TRANSFORMATION, AND WE LOOK FORWARD TO REFLECTING ON OUR SHARED ACCOMPLISHMENTS THROUGHOUT THE COMING YEAR.

Levo International: Fighting Food Insecurity with Hydroponics

This year, we continued our partnership with Levo International, supporting their urban farm expansion. Volunteers worked across three sites, playing a vital role in relocating the farm from Bloomfield to Homestead Avenue and beginning the transformation of a blighted plot of land into a thriving urban farm. In this new year, we will continue this work, turning what was once an eyesore in Hartford into a space of growth, renewal, and nourishment for the community.

Volunteers of all ages work together to fight food insecurity in the Hartford area. To the right, members of our Family and Teen Focus 4:12 Faith Formation programs work with Levo, and adult volunteers built the first greenhouse on the new site.

Increasing Sustainability at our Doorstep: Access to Clean Water

We also deepened our focus on sustainability and care for creation. After eliminating single-use plastic water bottles, we began distributing stainless steel reusable water bottles to our guests. We are also exploring the installation of a permanent water bottle filling station to ensure permanent access to clean water, especially during the summer heat.

Wellness Center: Wellness, Education, and Serving Community Needs Additionally, our 20-year partnership with the University of Saint Joseph now

includes physician assistant students who, alongside nursing students, provide care and wellness checks for our guests, broadening the health services available. This collaboration demonstrates the powerful intersection of education and service in meeting community needs.





Food Security: Sandwiches, Hot Meals, House of Bread

We are proud to share that our efforts in food security were recognized at a national level. See the video from our national province that highlights this vital work by scanning the QR code.



Greater Hartford Interfaith Action Alliance: Advocating for Change, Together

In 2024, we welcomed hundreds of our neighbors from other faith communities as we hosted a Greater Hartford Interfaith Action Alliance multi-faith community meeting in March, as well as GHIAA's delegates assembly in June. These events helped determine the coalition's agenda for 2025, which includes affordable housing and equitable fiscal policy in our state.

Housing Insecurity: Partnering with Local Organizations

We sent teams to work with Habitat for Humanity, Rebuilding Together, and St. Francis Builds to help alleviate housing insecurity both near and far. Here in Hartford, our people worked to create five affordable homes. In Oaxaca Mexico, we built three schools, for a total of seven in the last 18 months.

collaboration with Faith Formation. (See more at spsact.org/clare2) Clare Gallery hosted a workshop with our youth who created their own art that was displayed in the



A special mission at a Derby parish will include veneration of a first-class relic of St. Jude Thaddeus, one of the Twelve Apostles of Jesus Christ.

The relic, an arm bone of St. Jude's right hand, can be venerated during the "St. Jude Mission, Mass and Veneration" from March 10 to 12 at St. Mary the Immaculate Conception Church, part of Our Lady, Queen of the Apostles Parish.

Born around the year 5 A.D., St. Jude is venerated as the patron saint of lost causes and desperate situations. His intercessions have inspired devotions for centuries. If people pray to St. Jude in times of distress, it is said he will intercede and help them find the strength to continue.

The mission will mark the beginning of Lent and celebrate the Jubilee Year of Hope 2025 designated by Pope Francis. The event will also honor the patron saint of the former St. Jude Church, now part of Our Lady, Queen of the Apostles Parish.

"I feel like the Holy Spirit brought this together for us in the Jubilee Year and for people to come together and deepen their friendship with Christ and with the Holy Spirit, who is the well-spring of hope and is fueled by the work of the apostles, like St. Jude," says Father Jeffrey Gubbiotti, pastor.

The St. Jude mission will be conducted by Father Michail P. Ford, O.P., director of the Dominican Shrine of St. Jude Thaddeus in Chicago. He travels throughout the United States, teaching on a myriad of topics including Catholic devotions.

As the universal Church embraces the Jubilee Year of Hope, the Shrine of St. Jude continues to serve as a powerful symbol of faith and perseverance. "It reminds the faithful that even in the most desperate situations, hope prevails," Father Ford says. "St. Jude is the apostle of seemingly impossible situations."

After his martyrdom, St. Jude's body was buried in Iraq, formerly known as Mesopotamia. It was later moved to St. Peter's Basilica in Rome where it rests with other apostles.

Centuries ago, a small relic from St. Jude's forearm was encased into a silver reliquary and preserved for many years in three different locations: Armenia, Turkey and Turin, Italy. In 1949, the Dominicans in Turin presented the relic to the Dominican Shrine of St. Jude on its 20th anniversary dedication. Mission preaching, oil blessings, confessions, a prayer service with music and veneration of the relic will begin at 7 p.m. on March 10 and 11 at St. Mary the Immaculate Conception Church, 212 Elizabeth St., Derby. The mission will conclude with a St. Jude Mass and veneration at 7 p.m. on March 12, at the Church. Father Ford will also speak at all Masses in the parish during the weekend of March 8 and 9.

"The true impact of these missions lies in the powerful faith-filled stories we hear," Father Ford says. "At a recent mission, a young woman tearfully shared how her faith in St. Jude's intercession never wavered when her husband was on the brink of death. Now, though not yet fully recovered, he stood beside her, a living testament to faith and hope."


