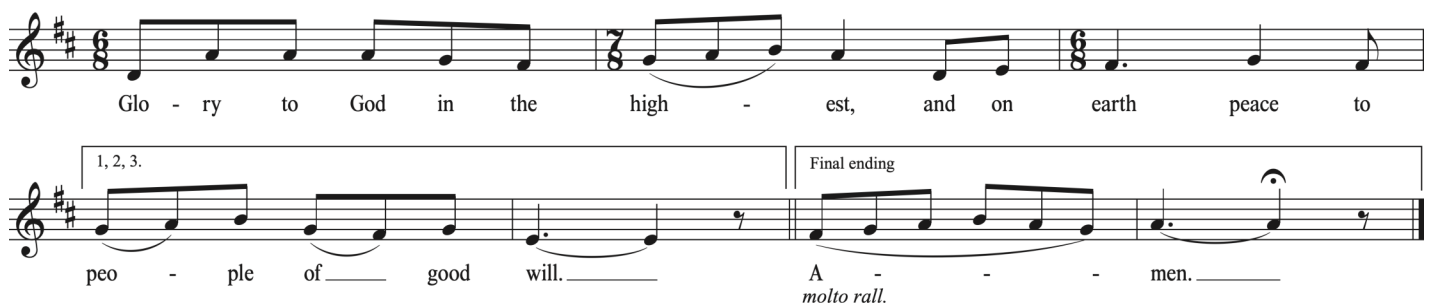

NICENE CREED




