The Pastor's Corner

June 22, 2025

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

A little over a year ago we welcomed my former colleague, Joseph Nuzzi, who came from New York to present several reflections on the Eucharist. He was very well received by those who attended his sessions, and a number of you asked if he might return to make another presentation. Joe has since taken a new position as President and Executive Director of RENEW International, so his availability is somewhat limited.

Nevertheless, we continue to benefit from Joe's time with us, as we grow and deepen our love for the Eucharist as a community of faith. We have made significant progress over the past few years after the pandemic forced us to make numerous changes in the way we worship. I am happy to see more people at Mass, with many joining us for the first time. I am also pleased that more parishioners are receiving the Blood of Christ from the cup at weekend Masses.

However, since it is the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, I'd like to repeat some of what I wrote back in 2023 regarding reception of the Eucharist:

St. Cyril of Jerusalem in 348 gave this instruction to his congregation: "When you approach Holy Communion, make the left hand into a throne for the right, which will receive the King. With your hand hollowed, receive the Body of Christ and answer 'Amen.'"

Thus, as we receive the Body of Christ, our hands should be open,



with one hand on top of the other, rather than side-by-side, so that the host may be placed there securely. Our vocal response of "Amen" should be intentional, not silent or mumbled.

This instruction always bears repeating, and to think again of the sacredness of a moment that should not be rushed or done casually. It is always a statement or proclamation of faith when we receive the Eucharist.

St. Augustine, one of the greatest doctors of the ancient Church, taught specifically about saying "Amen" in one of his sermons. He said: "If you are the body and members of Christ, then it is your sacrament that is placed on the table of the Lord; it is your sacrament that you receive. To that which you are, you respond 'Amen' ('yes, it is true!'), and by responding to it, you assent to it. For you hear the words, 'the Body of Christ' and respond 'Amen.' Be then a member of the Body of Christ that your 'Amen' may be true."

May our belief in the real presence of the Lord in the Eucharist never waver, but grow stronger each time we share his Body and Blood, given for the life of the world.

Women of Hope Ministry

Are you in need of inspiration and HOPE?

The Leadership Conference of Women Religious published a statement in January responding to the difficult and challenging realities of today. The statement witnesses to the convictions of faith and the advocacy to which Sisters have committed themselves. The tone of their words is one of courage, determination, and wisdom. They know their own truth as women religious and speak that truth to the prevailing political environment.

Here is the second section from the LCWR's Statement for your own reflection:

What we are witnessing in society today goes against the principles that we, as Catholic sisters, have labored for centuries to nurture and protect. Recalling these beliefs is an important exercise for us as we are confronted with rhetoric that urges us to change course and actions that oppose our principles. These values, around which we have spoken publicly and that have guided our lives, include:

- *The belief in the inherent right to life of all human beings and the dignity of each life*
- *The commitment to the Gospel demands of love, welcome, and care for all people, especially those who are most vulnerable*
- *The duty to welcome immigrants and provide care and aid to all in our land, while insisting on comprehensive immigration reform*
- *The responsibility to stand against violence in all its forms*
- *The commitment to dismantle systemic racism*
- *The belief that care of our planet Earth requires our attention and action*
- *Respect for the journey of all persons into the wholeness of their humanness*
- *The work to alleviate poverty in all forms*

Staying steadfast to these principles in the face of powerful forces working towards contrary purposes may be one of the hardest challenges we will encounter – collectively and individually. The efforts to be the face of compassion and hope amid actions that create chaos and fear will not be easy. This is a time when we will need one another, and a time when we can lend our voices and our support to many of the organizations and people of faith who are laboring to bear witness to the dignity of each person.

that a nuclear exchange using as few as 100 weapons anywhere in the world would disrupt the global climate and agricultural production, causing mass starvation?



St. Francis crossed enemy lines in Egypt to speak with the Caliph. He didn't prevent war, but he did establish common ground between enemies. Pope Francis⁺ voiced his opposition to nuclear weapons and called for their abolition, emphasizing that their use is a crime against humanity and the environment. The U.S. Catholic Bishops have numerous statements and resources about the issues of nuclear weapons. 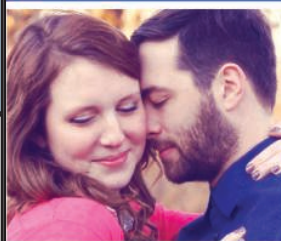
