# The Pastor's Corner

December 28, 2025

Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As we bring 2025 to a close, I keep thinking about what a momentous year it has been, both in the Church and in our world, especially here in our own country.

First, however, I wish to thank all of you for your prayerful support of me and the other friars who minister at St. Patrick-St. Anthony. As you know, one of the friars, Fr. Francis Soucy, has spent the past few months in rehab for mobility issues, but he continues to make progress and is doing well at the age of 87.

I also want to express my deepest thanks for your ongoing financial support. To date, our Parish Annual Appeal has raised \$62,470.50 which will be used on various improvement projects. Our apologies for the delay in acknowledging your gift. You should see it within the next two weeks.

A few weeks ago I mentioned that our parish had contributed over \$100,000 to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal. At the moment the amount stands at \$101,720.42. This is a remarkable achievement, and I am duly impressed by your generosity to the local church.

Ours is a very generous and selfless parish whose members care deeply for the needs of others. This is expressed in the weekly collections as well as in the special second collections taken during the year. Of particular note was the Christmas in July campaign to support our Sister Parish of Saint Geneviève in Haiti.

Please mark your calendar for Saturday, January 17, 2026 when we will have a celebration of twenty years of the covenant between St. Patrick-St. Anthony and Saint Geneviève at 4:00 PM Mass, followed by a festive gathering in the Franciscan Center.

On January 1st we celebrate New Year's Day. As Catholics, we also



celebrate the Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God. This is one of the oldest titles of Mary, dating back to the Council of Ephesus in 431 AD. Over the centuries other titles were bestowed upon her, as well as definitions of Marian doctrine, such as her Immaculate Conception and Assumption into heaven.

Recently, the Dicastery for the Doctrine of the Faith released a doctrinal note on Marian titles, especially to clarify the titles of "Co-Redemptrix" and "Mediatatrix." The clarifications were not intended to lower Mary's stature, but to remind us that Mary's role in our salvation is completely dependent upon the role of Jesus as our sole Redeemer. As the note states: "The title of 'Co-redemptrix' is deemed inappropriate and problematic. The title of 'Mediatatrix' is considered unacceptable when it takes on a meaning that excludes Jesus Christ; however, it can be used appropriately so long as it expresses an inclusive and participatory mediation that glorifies the power of Christ."

Mary's role as the mother of Jesus and hence, "Mother of God" as defined in the 5th century at Ephesus, is the *sine qua non* of our Catholic devotion to her. Mary was the first disciple of Christ who continues to lead us to her Son through her maternal love. We honor Mary in a true and correct manner as long as our devotion leads us ultimately to Jesus Christ, our Lord and Redeemer. In the words of St. Louis de Monfort: "Ad Jesum per Mariam" – To Jesus through Mary.

May you have a happy, healthy and blessed New Year!

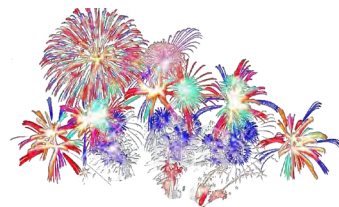

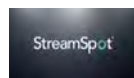

## ST. LUCIAN'S RESIDENCE COUNTS 100 YEARS OF SENIOR LIVING WITH SPIRITUAL PERKS

**M**onsignor Lucian Bojnowski, who served as a pastor to the Polish community in New Britain beginning in 1895, was an enterprising priest who dreamed of many ministries to uplift the locals. As pastor of Sacred Heart Parish, he founded a congregation of religious women, two grade schools, an academy, an orphanage and a home for the elderly.

One of his creations that continues to care for God's people to this day is St. Lucian's Residence, a residential senior living facility, which celebrated its 100th anniversary this year (1925 to 2025).

"He had an incredible vision," Robert Skarba, administrator of St. Lucian's Residence, says of Monsignor Bojnowski. Today, that vision is summarized in St. Lucian's Residence logo with the tagline "comfort, care and compassion."

"The ministry of St. Lucian's is a priority of the Daughters of Mary of the Immaculate Conception," says Sister Mary Janice Zdunczyk, a member of the congregation and director of St. Lucian's, who is in charge of providing that compassionate care. "It's our mission to support St. Lucian's financially, spiritually and socially."

Today, six sisters make their home at St. Lucian's Residence, a nonprofit residential senior living facility that welcomes people

age 65 and above. The sisters live on one floor of St. Lucian's Residence, while 15 lay people live on the floors below.

"I think our founder's purpose was to found a community with a faith dimension," Sister Mary Janice explains. "With that added spiritual dimension, the sisters are willing to share their community life with the lay people and vice versa."

"It's amazing how many residents join the sisters in prayer, holy hours and at various prayer services," Sister Mary Janice notes.

There is also a chapel, which draws the residents for daily Mass. Masses are celebrated by Father Lawrence Symolon, chaplain for the Daughters of Mary of the Immaculate Conception. While this spiritual legacy is being carried on, some things have changed.

Located on Burritt Street, St. Lucian's Residence was built in 1925 and gained a new wing in 1986, followed by many upgrades. Residents enjoy private rooms but can mingle in sitting rooms on every floor, in the dining hall and in a large social activity room.

Activities include exercise classes, bingo, movies and holiday parties. Meals, assistance with medication, laundry and other services are also available, if needed.

Resident Kasimier (Kaz) Marchut, a former long-distance runner, takes advantage of the weekly exercise classes. He also loves to read. "I've read every book in the library," he says, of the small library with English and Polish titles. But he says the best thing about living at St. Lucian's is "having good friends."

Luc A. Ouellette spent his working life as a Catholic school teacher at St. Ann Jr. High School and Sacred Heart School in New Britain, teaching reading, French and religion. He says he arrived at St. Lucian's because "I needed some things done for me – laundry and food prep."

Ouellette loves everything about St. Lucian's: "The schedule for meals, the quiet time in the building, the activities planned for us, the daily Mass and the rosary on Wednesday after Mass and on Sunday afternoons."

Three years ago, Sister Mary Lucille Banach, one of the Daughters of Mary and a retired nurse, moved from Boston to become a resident. "The best is the socialization. There are people around to talk to – or not talk to," she says with a laugh.

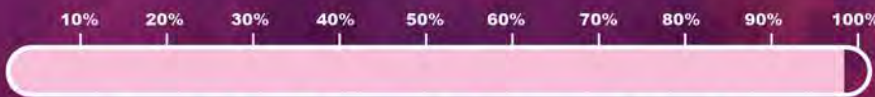
