# The Pastor's Corner

February 22, 2026

Dear Parishioners and Friends,



On this first Sunday of Lent, the whole Church enters into a period of preparation for the celebration of the Paschal Mystery: the Passion, Death and Resurrection of Christ. This is a sacred time, an opportunity to look more deeply into ourselves and discover once again the reality of who we are as God's sons and daughters – beloved yet frail.

I think we often enter into Lent with a mix of emotions: anxiety, dread, reluctance, but rarely eagerness or excitement. In much the same way that children dread the first day of school after summer vacation, we tend to look on Ash Wednesday as the moment when all the fun ends and we have to give up our favorite foods and creaturely comforts.

I have often said that, during Lent, we shouldn't think so much about giving *up* things, but giving *in* to what God may be calling forth from us. Perhaps God is calling us to be a little kinder or more patient. The choice or decision is always up to you, but don't put more pressure on yourself than necessary. Just try to grow closer to the Lord in your day-to-day life.



As you may have heard, Pope Leo XIV has declared a Jubilee Year of St. Francis that began January 10, 2026, and continues to January 10, 2027. The Holy Father is bringing the world's attention to the Saint of Assisi to coincide with the 800th anniversary of his death.
