# The Pastor's Corner

March 1, 2026



Dear Parishioners and Friends,

As I write this message I am occasionally glancing out the window as a bomb cyclone/blizzard/nor'easter creates a polar landscape throughout the Northeast. All this is coming in the final week of February, and we still have at least three more weeks before Spring arrives. Hopefully, by Easter Sunday we will be out of winter's severe grip. I hope everyone got through the snow and winds without too much difficulty.

You might notice that the covers of the bulletin for the Sundays of Lent this year feature paintings by the Italian artist Duccio di Buoninsegna who died in 1319. He lived most of his life in Siena, Tuscany, and one of his most famous works was the Maestà altarpiece for the Duomo (cathedral) in that city.

The Maestà consisted of a large painting of the Madonna and Child on the front side, and numerous smaller panels on the backside of scenes from the life of Mary and the life of Christ. The altarpiece was dedicated in the Duomo in 1311 and remained in place until 1771 when it was sawn in half (like two sides of an Oreo cookie), and many of the panels ended up being dispersed to museums in Europe and the United States.

About a year ago I wrote about an exhibition at the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York entitled "Siena: The Rise of Painting (1300-1350)", which included a collection of individual panels from the Maestà. Coincidentally, five of the panels from the exhibit depicted the Gospel scenes for Lent in Year A: the temptation of Jesus on the mountain; the Transfiguration of Jesus (a photo I took myself); the Samaritan woman at the well; the man born blind; the raising of Lazarus. Each of the bulletin covers for the five Sundays of Lent will feature these paintings, as well as a separate painting by Duccio for Palm Sunday.

To have the opportunity of viewing these paintings in person, and in their original arrangement, was a rare treat; I hope you will enjoy seeing them here one at a time!

## St. Genevieve: Persevering Through New Challenges

Despite the many crises Haiti has endured, St. Genevieve School has continued to grow since our support began in 2005. Over the years, we have added grade levels, expanded our staff, increased enrollment, and broadened the curriculum. Our students consistently succeed on national exams — a testament to their dedication and the commitment of our teachers.

Today, however, escalating violence has brought significant new challenges. Enrollment has approximately doubled since instability intensified several years ago. With gangs present in the Zoranje area and insecurity forcing nearby public and private schools to close, many displaced students have found refuge at St. Genevieve, adding to our school ranks. Somehow, through determination and faith, space is found and every child receives a hot meal each day.

The buildings were never big enough to host all day classes so elementary classes are in the morning, and older students attend in the afternoon. The day begins for each session with an assembly for prayer and flag raising. St. Genevieve also has several satellite schools further out in Fr. Gaby's parish. Currently over 100 students are enrolled with 7 staff. No meals are served and only basic subjects are taught.

We remain hopeful that the current hardships will give way to a stable government, reduced inflation, and lasting safety and peace for all of Haiti.

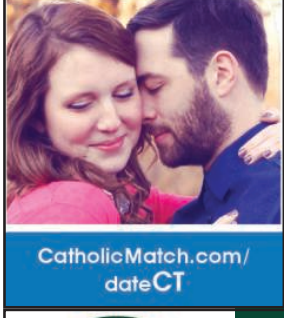

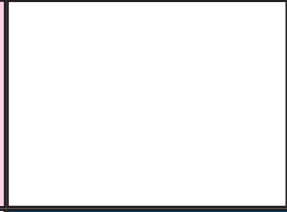
