The feasts of Saint Patrick and Saint Joseph will be celebrated this coming week. I had the honor of celebrating a Mass on Friday, March 6th, the eve of the annual St. Patrick's Parade. As one of our parish's patron saints, may Patrick intercede for us to keep us a strong and faith-filled community. May St. Joseph, whose feast falls on March 19th, patron of the Archdiocese of Hartford, intercede for both the local and universal church.

So far, our parish has pledged \$17,052.50 to the Archbishop's Annual Appeal from 66 donors – thank you! If you haven't yet given or pledged a gift, please don't forget to do so. Our parish's goal is \$115,000. In 2025 we reached \$101,413, the highest total in many years; so let's try to do as well this year!

The presentations will be given on Saturday, March 21st, from 5 to 7 PM, and Sunday, March 22nd, from the 9 to 9:45 AM and 11:15 AM to 1:00 PM. Also, don't forget the Ladies Guild Spring Basket Bazaar taking place again this weekend in the Franciscan Center after all Masses. Your support helps the Guild to provide scholarships for deserving young parishioners in area Catholic schools.

Let us continue to pray for an end to the military conflict in the Middle East between the United States, Israel and Iran, which is beginning to have an impact on other countries as well. The Middle East has suffered so much over the course of time because of war and hatred, and the current conflict has added one more round of bloodshed and destruction which is only making matters worse. May peace and stability come to lands that have known so much violence in recent years.

One could say she "paints" with fabric—its colors, designs, and textures—making work that speaks about her own lived experience, as well as the lives of others she chooses to portray. Through her work, she intends to create a conversation with her audiences explaining that it speaks to "who I am, where I come from, what I see, and where I am going." 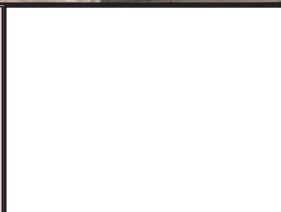
